

Year-end Giving

Here at Christ’s Hands we have been blessed to continue in the ministries that have been laid out before us. The growth we have experienced has been accomplished by the dedication of our many volunteers and donors.

We encourage you to consider making a year-end contribution. Without your generous support the ministries would not be possible.

Thank you for your continued support and prayers for these Kingdom building ministries.

The **New Covenant Kitchen** is open Monday through Friday and the last Sunday of every month. The

volunteer cooks arrive at 9am and usually finish preparing the daily meal by noon, followed by the evening volunteers arriving between 3 and 4pm to prepare the meals to be delivered to shut-ins. The evening meal begins with a devotion and prayer at 5pm. Volunteers are always needed to help the cooks in the mornings, deliver meals and to help serve in the evenings. In 2016 each month **averaged over 1900 meals served** with a yearly total of approximately **23,240 meals**. The morning cooks and evening volunteers provided over **600 hours of service monthly**.

The **Furniture Ministry** provides used appliances, beds, furniture and household goods to the needy primarily victims of fire, single parents and those in recovery. This year **over 200 donated items** were given to those in need.

December 2015 through February 2016 the **Winter Shelter** provided a warm and safe environment for those needing a place to sleep by offering a cot, blanket and a pillow. During that time, we provided **54 night stays**. This year the winter shelter opened in November and we anticipate staying open through February provided the money needed can be raised. We are seeking to raise \$20,000 to be open 4 months; currently over \$10,000 has been raised.

In 2015 we installed a generator and were also able to make a few other upgrades to the facility that has enabled us to offer a **Severe Weather Shelter** to the community. The shelter is made available to the public in partnership with the Harlan County Emergency Management office and other local partners in times of natural disaster and inclement weather. In January 2016 we were able to offer emergency shelter to the community for over **100 consecutive hours** during a winter storm event.

The **Harlan County Emergency Food Pantry** has been serving the community for over 20 years. The pantry is open Monday and Tuesday of the third week each month from 9am to 1pm. Individuals are required to provide identification, a 911 address in Harlan County and proof of income, however no one is ever turned away. In 2016 our dedicated **volunteers served over 1500 hours** to operate the pantry.

Approximately 2750 food boxes were served in 2016, consisting of **630 adults and over 115 children monthly**. We accept any and all donations to help provide the needed items to fill the food boxes.

You will! That food drive that you held for Christ's Hands has been safely stored and will be coming off the shelf in the coming months to provide a good wholesome dinner to someone in need. Our volunteers are working throughout the year to distribute this food. Your gift can really make a difference.

With our local economy in a severe decline, those needing our services are constantly rising. It is heartening to know these people will not have to worry how they will feed their family tonight. Because you gave to Christ's Hands, clients often are so thankful for the help; they leave with tears in their eyes.

This year we started operating a **Hospitality Ministry** to individuals and groups ministering in Harlan offering accommodations for groups up to 60. Volunteers help keep the space clean and ready for guests. We are humbled to have a **missionary group** using this space monthly. Offering this space has opened the door to minister in new ways, such as housing **20 firefighters** who came to fight forest fires throughout the county this Fall.

In December of 2015 we entered into a new **Distribution Ministry**. In partnership with the Mid-West Food Bank in Peoria, Illinois, we are distributing food to area churches and pantries. In 2016, we **distributed 303,500 tons of food** to our partners. This led to the need for and installation of a 12' by 40' walk-in-freezer allowing us to receive bulk frozen items for the first time. Through this partnership with Mid-West, every month frozen food and dry goods are being sent to **3 school programs, 9 pantries and 12 churches in 3 different counties**.

There are several other ministries Christ's Hands is currently involved in. At the heart of each and every ministry we endeavor to work through is the passion for sharing the Gospel.
