“God’s Ways are not our ways”

God works in the most mysterious and amazing ways! Last summer, I met Bryan at Little Buckaroo Horse Camp (our kids were participating, not us). Our wives already knew each other from a home school group they attend. Bryan and I talked about the ministry (I’m a local pastor), evangelism, and needs within our community. One of the first things that stands out about Bryan is his passion to tell others about Jesus. One of the ministries that God had just begun to make reality in our church was a fishing ministry with local kids. In a miraculous move of God, 80 rods, reels, and tackle was given to this budding ministry at our church. I was very excited about what God was doing and enjoyed talking with Bryan about the future possibilities of this outreach opportunity.

About two weeks after first meeting Bryan and hearing about his work with Christ’s Hands, he called to ask me if I would tie flies with some of the cadets from the Challenge Academy as part of their community service and mentoring. I had just taken up the practice of fly tying and looked forward to using it in ministry. Sitting at a tying bench and carefully tying flies with thread, clumps of fur, and feathers can be very detailed and, at times, frustrating. It is also rewarding. He envisioned the project as a chance to teach a skill, invest time and build a relationship with these young men, and introduce them to Jesus.

I am forever indebted to Chad Morgan and Shawn Crow who came and assisted with all matters fishing and spiritual. They are certainly the strength to balance my deficiencies. We had the opportunity to spend five weeks each with two groups of cadets from the Academy. We tied flies. We prayed together. We read Scripture. We talked about life, God’s wisdom, and the gospel. We watch as these young men shared their struggles, expressed fears, and their hearts soften to the reality of God’s love. Several of the cadets had no previous experience with God, the Bible, or church. Some picked up a Bible for the first time in their life at our weekly Bible study. Some of them even tied some decent flies!

It’s amazing how God works through a casual meeting of two dads at horse camp, to use what passions He has instilled in us, to get glory for His Name. Who could have imagined that a little fur and some feathers could do so much in God’s hands.

Christ’s Hands Needs List

- Replacement rear roll up door for our Freightliner box truck \$1000
- Split-unit heat pump for the Good Samaritans Room and new Day Room \$2000
- LED light bulbs to finish the upgrade to 100% LED lighting in the building \$1200
- Replace three 80-gallon electric water heaters with one tankless on-demand gas unit \$1550
- One year’s supply of latex gloves for the kitchen \$1750
- One year’s supply of to-go trays to serve hot meals to our home bound clients \$1250
- One season to operate Christ’s Hands Winter Shelter \$15,000
- One year’s supply of 50 and 13-gallon trash bags \$1200
- One semi-truck of food acquired through Operation Blessing \$2500

Christ’s Hands was the recipient of Post 10’s ‘Cram the Cruiser’ Food Drive. We received over 2000lbs of food that will be distributed in food boxes during December to the community. We are thankful for the officers and local schools who made this possible.

This Month’s Q&A



Q: How does Christ’s Hands use all the space in that building?

The building is about 30,000sqft. which allows for many opportunities.

The 1st floor consists of our offices and conference room, the Good Samaritan Room, a new sitting room, the kitchen and dining hall which doubles as our winter shelter, a shower and laundry area for our clients, a root cellar, a walk-in freezer and cooler, our food for the kitchen, our storage and processing area for the food pantry and space for the food bank operations.

The 2nd floor houses the hospitality center with 100 beds for mission teams, 2 large bathrooms, 2 smaller bathrooms, 2 staff bedrooms, a kitchen and dining hall which is also our large class room, a smaller class room, and our woodworking shop.

The 3rd floor contains our storage and processing center for the Good Samaritan ministry, and our community room which sits about 250 with a stage and separate game area and 2 bathrooms.

We have maximized the square footage as best we can. The next step for our growth will be looking to expand in new ways. As God leads, we will follow.
