If I were speaking to you from the pulpit at your church, you would expect to hear something spiritual. But, what if the police came in and handcuffed me and took me away to jail. Someone might say they heard I was caught shop-lifting at a local store, but the real truth comes out the next day in the newspaper....I am a serial killer! Well, I go to trial and the jury finds me guilty and I am sentenced to the electric chair in two weeks. Let's say I have a good friend, Bill, who goes to the judge and tries to use his influence to "get me off." Bill then says he will offer himself in my place. The judge says, "Nothing doing, he's going to the chair. But wait a minute, you have a son don't you.... Well, I'll take him." Bill says, "My only son!" But Bill's love for me is great and he tells the judge he will offer his son as a substitute for me on my execution day. The day comes and Bill brings his son to the place of execution. Knocks on the door and the guard opens it up and Bill starts to tell his son "good-by." The guard says, "Hold on, you don't understand. You will have to go in and strap him in the chair." With a heavy heart Bill goes in and does just that. His son looks up at him with tears dripping from his chin and says, "Father, why have you forsaken me like this." Bill then turns from his son to walk out and the guard stops him and says, "Hold on, now you have to push the button that ends the life of your son!" With that, Bill pushes the button and ends his son's life and I am instantly freed. Several days later Bill walks in to a restaurant and sees me sitting in a booth with someone. He sits down behind the booth as he sees I am talking to them. But he hears the conversation between me and the other person. "How in the world did you get out of being executed," I am asked. "Well, me and the judge are good friends, and you know, I used to help little old ladies across the street. I even tossed in a hundred dollars in the offering plate every now and then. The judge realized I was a pretty good guy." The truth is, it was Bill's son that freed me, not my good deeds.

Some day we will all stand before Christ. Please, I repeat, please, do not rely on your good works to go to Heaven. The Bible says that good works are but filthy rags. If you're a Christian, your good works are the fruit of your salvation and the result of your salvation.

The story I just told is gripping but is necessary to get the point across. At Christ's Hands there are many Christians who, as a result of salvation, realize the need here. They are literally giving of themselves and want to make a difference. Please, as you continue to give and sacrifice for Christ's Hands, it is our prayer that we can make a difference physically (through the food and services we give) as well as spiritually. Appalachian Service Project

Appalachia Service Project (ASP) is a Christian ministry, open to all people, that inspires hope and service through volunteer home repair and replacement in Central Appalachia. In 1969, Rev. Glenn "Tex" Evans – a United Methodist minister – became one of the first people to connect the energy of youth with the deep needs of the poor. Since 1969, 393,643 volunteers from across the nation have repaired 17,866 homes and, in the process, Appalachian families, volunteers, and staff have been immeasurably blessed. ASP is based out of Johnson City, TN and provides home repairs in Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia, and West Virginia. ASP envisions the eradication of substandard housing in Central Appalachia and the transformation of everyone who comes in contact with this ministry. ASP has been coming to serve the Harlan County community since 1981. We are lucky to have created strong partners in the community that allow us to return year after year.

Over the past couple of years, ASP's facility needs in Harlan County started to outgrow what previous facilities could offer. ASP was lucky to build great relationships with Christ's Hands and others in the community that transpired into being able to stay at Christ's Hands this past summer. 23 different volunteer groups, consisting of 570 people, from 12 different states, came to stay at Christ's Hands this summer. 143 projects, across 14 homes, were completed, to help 40 people. The most common projects that ASP completed were floor repair, wall repair, and safe exits/entrances into homes. ASP was also able to complete a few roofs consisting of entire repairs and/or patches, door and window replacements, underpinning and drainage ditches. All of this work would not have been possible without the partnership and community of Christ's Hands.

The Ministries of Christ's Hands

Christ's Hands is open weekdays to assist anyone in need to the extent of our capabilities. Donations are received weekdays between 9am and 12pm and again between 4pm and 6pm. Our services include:

- The New Covenant Kitchen: Meals are served Monday through Friday at 5pm and the last Sunday of each month. All are welcome to fellowship over this meal.
- The Harlan County Emergency Food Pantry: Foods boxes are distributed on Mondays and Tuesdays of the third full week of each month. A valid ID and proof of residency in Harlan County is required. Food boxes are available daily as needed but all clients are advised to come to the scheduled distribution days.
- The Good Samaritan Room: this ministry is open Mondays 10am to 2pm, Tuesdays and Thursday 4:30pm to 5:30pm, Wednesdays and Fridays 11am to 12pm. Clothing, household items, furniture, hygiene products, and more are distributed free of charge that have been donated and are available to those in need. (Days and hours are subject to change due to volunteer availability).
- The Winter Emergency Shelter: The shelter is scheduled to open December 1st and closes on February 28th. If temperatures drop below 32° operations could begin before and extend later. A valid ID is required of clients.
- The Hospitality Center: Mission groups large and small can stay year round in this facility. This space includes family rooms, group rooms, a kitchen and dining area, and male and female bath and shower facilities.
